Subjective point of view of a person


- who never wanted to emigrate
- who is getting old far away from important people who left the country
- who seeks for meaning in his decision to stay in Romania

The narrative material:

- stories of migration constructed from in depth interviews
- my own life story connected to these people who emigrated, but also to a reference group of friends who stayed in the country
- my subjective recollections of important departures in my life

Basic elements of a story:


- story world, protagonist, weakness and need, problem, desire, opponents, plan, battle, self revelation, new equilibrium




As a person who never wanted to emigrate and never had this experience (but of the one left behind in the country), I try to compare these migration stories with important departures that I have experienced in my own life to discover some working useful concepts for analyzing these stories















I place migration in the class of other important departures we experience in our lives: birth, childhood explorations, adolescent quests, leaving home, estrangement from friends and death

All of these stories, that seem to have important departures at their core, define a class of primordial spaces (inside versus outside or home versus abroad) which configure pairs of concepts such as safety and challenge, belonging and separation, communion and solitude, renunciation and reconfiguration.

The dilemma of migration, the search for the self, breaking away from the community you came from in the hope that shock will take you out of your routine, the self revelation far from home, the return and synchronization in time - these are recurring themes in these stories.

The values of each generation that goes on a migration adventure are always different, but the hardships, setbacks and fulfillments are all about being human, relating to the world around us and continually reconfiguring the self in relation to others
